What is the CBRN National Action Plan

Within the framework of the European Union Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear Risk Mitigation Centres of Excellence (an initiative that involves more than 50 partner countries from Africa, South-East Europe, the Caucasus, Middle East, GCC, Central Asia and South-East Asia), the partner countries are preparing a CBRN National Action Plans.

The overall purpose of the National Action Plan is to articulate a national vision for CBRN risk mitigation and to identify priorities for building capacity. The National Action Plan assesses CBRN risks (criminal, accidental and natural), analyses existing capabilities, identifies gaps and propose specific actions to reinforce national policy and capacity. The National Action Plan is a unique instrument prepared by the National CBRN Team in coordination with relevant regional and international organizations taking into account existing instruments and activities.

Currently, six countries in South East Asia region are engaged in the preparation of the CBRN National Action Plan.

Overview

As a follow up of all the projects under the initiative of CBRN training and preparedness in the region, we would like to propose training programs to enhance biosafety and biosecurity as well as emergency preparedness.

The aim of this discussion is to identify the model to adopt, some points to be discussed will be as follows:

- Countries in the region are very diverse in the legislation, training, knowledge and resources.
- Core group of trainers to be identified from the region and from other regions, it is critical that this core group is chosen carefully so that the program can be well executed.
- Core group of specialist trainers will develop, together with the receiving country representatives, training program that is relevant to the local situation.
- Core group of specialist trainers will identify 2 countries for a start, identify the local representative and prepare the training material. Training will be developed for the train the trainer program so that those trained can continue to setup the training locally.
- It is essential that the training is fully tailored to the local situation
- The training can be tailored in such a way that the trainee can attempt certification exams offered by International Federation of Biosafety Association and other bodies.
- Resources required for the training will include travel expense, local expenses like venue, PPE and other such items.
